Self-Check-In screens



When coming to the medical centre for your appointment please use the Self Check-In screens located either side of the reception desk.

Initially put in your birth month and date you were born. Please be aware you will need to press the actual number, for example if you were born on the 12th, press the 12 on the screen. Then the first letter of your last name. The screen will then mark you as arrived, inform you which waiting room to proceed to, and which clinician you will be seeing for your appointment.

Using the self-check-in option removes the need to queue. Allowing the patient advisor to concentrate on:

- Making future appointments for patients
- Managing enquiries
- Processing mail
- Handling deliveries
- Processing prescriptions
- Preparing samples and paperwork for the hospital laboratory

Let us know if you are a carer for someone who is a patient at the Practice.
